The Recipe For Thanksgiving

1. DASH OF SHOUTING

Psalm 100:1-2 (ESV)- Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth!

When we come into worship don't look around, but look up.

2. SCOOP OF SERVING

Psalm 100:2a (ESV)- Serve the Lord with gladness!

Serve not out of obligation, but appreciation.

3. SPRINKLE OF SINGING

Psalm 100:2b (ESV)- Come into his presence with singing!

Singing expresses that which cannot be said.

4. PAUSE FOR REFLECTION

Psalm 100:3 (ESV)-Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

Who He is, what He has done, and what He is doing.

5. CUP OF GRATITUDE

Psalm 100:4 (ESV)-Enter his gates with <u>thanksgiving</u>, and his courts with <u>praise</u>! Give <u>thanks</u> to him; <u>bless</u> his name!

Thanksgiving happens when we have the right perspective.

6. ENJOY

Psalm 100:5 (ESV)-For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.

Taste His goodness, full on His love, and rest in His faithfulness.
