1. THE REQUESTS

Psalm 51:1-2 (ESV)-Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!

2. THE REALIZATIONS

Psalm 51:3-5 (ESV)- For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment. Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.

3. THE RESTORATION

Psalm 51:7,10,12(ESV)-Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow...Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me...Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit

4. THE RESULT

Psalm 51:13-15 (ESV)- Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.... and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness... and my mouth will declare your praise.

A. Practice confession

Psalm 51:4 (ESV)-Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight

B. Desire repentance

Psalm 51:10 (ESV)-Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

C. Trust restoration

Psalm 51:17 (ESV)- The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
