## 1. THE PROBLEM

2 Chronicles 20:2-3 (ESV)- Some men came and told Jehoshaphat, “A great multitude is coming against you... Then Jehoshaphat was afraid...

## 2. THE PRAYER

2 Chronicles 20:1:3-4,12 (ESV)- set his face to seek the Lord... And Judah assembled to seek help from the Lord...“For we are powerless against this great horde that is coming against us. We do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you.”

## 3. THE PROMISE

2 Chronicles 20:15,17(ESV)-Thus says the Lord to you, ‘Do not be afraid and do not be dismayed at this great horde, for the battle is not yours but God’s. Stand firm, hold your position, and see the salvation of the Lord... Tomorrow go out against them, and the Lord will be with you.

## 4. THE PRAISE

2 Chronicles 20:21 (ESV)-he appointed those who were to sing to the Lord and praise him in holy attire, as they went before the army, and say, “Give thanks to the Lord, for his steadfast love endures forever.”

2 Chronicles 20:4 (ESV)-And Judah assembled to seek help from the Lord; from all the cities of Judah they came to seek the Lord

#### B. Keep believing

2 Chronicles 20:20 (ESV)-Believe in the Lord your God, and you will be established; believe his prophets, and you will succeed.

#### C. Keep worshipping

2 Chronicles 20:22 (ESV)- And when they began to sing and praise, the Lord set an ambush against the men...who had come against Judah, so that they were routed
