Review Last Message

Irony Summary of Chapter 3: God's Word had to come to Jonah a second time. A prophet was sent to the enemies of Israel. Nineveh was important to God. The people believed God when Jonah had not. The people repented when Jonah would not. The powerful humbled themselves. The enemies of Israel were spared by the God of Israel.

The Point: God responds to a repentant heart!

1. WHAT JONAH DEDUCED

Jonah 4:1-2 (ESV)- But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. And he prayed to the Lord and said, "O Lord, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster.

Study Verse: (וַיַּחַר לְּוֹ חַיְּחַר לְּהֹ בְיִּחָר בְּיִלָה וְיִּחַר לִוֹ) "It was evil to Jonah with great evil and he burned."

2. WHAT JONAH DISMISSED

Jonah 4:3 (ESV)- Therefore now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live." And the Lord said, "<u>Do you do well to be angry?</u>"

Jonah 2:6 (ESV)-I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever; yet you brought up my life from the pit, O Lord my God

3. WHAT JONAH DESIRED

His Control

Jonah 4:5 (ESV)- Jonah went out of the city and sat to the east of the city and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, till he should see what would become of the city.

His Comfort

Jonah 4:6 (ESV)- Now the Lord God appointed a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be a shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort. So Jonah was exceedingly glad because of the plant.

Word Study: Simhah (שֹמחה) - joy, gladness, mirth, exceedingly glad

His Concern

Jonah 4:7-8 (ESV)- But when dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that attacked the plant, so that it withered. When the sun rose, God appointed a scorching east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint. And he asked that he might die and said, "It is better for me to die than to live.

4. WHAT GOD DESIRES

Jonah 4:9-11 (ESV)-But God said to Jonah, "Do you do well to be angry for the plant?" And he said, "Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die." And the Lord said, "You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?

Here is the Point: God cares for all He has created!



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
